- Once the ARISS Team has finalized a new QSL card, Europe has offered to get prices for printing cards. They believe they can get prices below the cost of the first printing ( 38 cents USD).
- The ARISS Team needs to progress in finalizing the card, since the inventory of card stock is nearly gone in all ARISS regions.
