San Diego Facts

Climate: The average year-round high temperature is 70.2 degrees. The yearly rainfall is light, averaging 9.45 inches with most rain during the months of December, January and February.

Clothing: Comfortable and casual best describes appropriate attire for San Diego! We do suggest a sweater or light jacket for the evenings and comfortable shoes for exploring our fine attractions.

The City: The birthplace of the Golden State. Discovered by Portuguese explorer Juan Rodriguez Cabrillo in 1542. Later, Spanish and Mexican conquerors laid claim to the region and their influences are also undeniably felt. San Diego has grown to become the second largest city in the West. Sometimes called “**The Harbor of the Sun**”. Over two million residents are scattered across a 30 mile stretch of rolling hills, fertile valleys and sparkling beaches. Twenty-eight percent of the total United States fleet is based here and the Navy is the city’s largest single employer. Military expenditures in the city exceed \$2 billion annually. Charles Lindbergh came here to build his customized Ryan Monoplane, “The Spirit of St. Louis.” Ranking first in the nation for fresh market tomatoes, eggs and avocados, San Diego also exports over 50 tons of cut flowers annually. Over 28,000 residents have sailing vessels of their own for pleasure. Two artificial islands have been constructed to provide for additional marinas and docking space.

Attractions:

The World Famous **San Diego Zoo** which contains a rare collection of exotic species.

Sea World a fun filled water animal theme park in the center of 4600-acre Mission Bay Aquatic Park..

San Diego Wild Animal Park set in an authentic African and Asian setting.

Seaport Village, explore dozens of unique shops and amusements from the early California setting.

Don’t forget to ride the merry-go-round.

Old Town and **Bazaar del Mundo** shops.

Balboa Park Museums.

2. **San Diego Zoo Tour.** Suggested for Friday or Saturday. Departs at 9:00 A.M. Returns by 2:30 P.M. This fun tour is a view of one of the finest zoos in the world. Filled with lush plants and vegetation, and animals that are nearly extinct. The zoo recently received two new Chinese Pandas from China for a twelve year stay. The zoo offers many places to enjoy a snack or a full meal. You will also enjoy a guided bus tours around the facility when you first arrive. Later you can return to your favorite exhibits. **The price per person, all inclusive is \$30.00**

3. **San Diego Harbor Dinner Cruise.** Suggested for Friday evening. Departs at 6:30 P.M. Returns back to the hotel by 10:30 P.M. The fun evening consists of a 2 1/2 hour dinner cruise.
